

Together, We're Protecting Your Pipes and Your Family

As part of our ongoing commitment to reducing lead exposure in drinking water, JXN Water is actively working to identify all drinking water service line materials throughout the water system, in accordance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Lead and Copper Rule Revisions.



What is a water service line?

A water service line is a water pipe connecting your building to the public water system water main.

Ownership of the water service line is split as shown in the graphic above. JXN Water owns the portion of the service line from the water main to the water meter, and the property owner owns the portion of the service line from the water meter to the building.

JXN Water created an inventory of the water system to find needed repairs and replacements.

Our records indicate that your property has a galvanized iron service line that may have absorbed lead. EPA has defined these service lines as "galvanized requiring replacement". People living in homes with a galvanized service line may have an increased risk of exposure to lead from their drinking water.

This letter serves to notify you of this risk and provides information to help you reduce your risk of lead exposure. Please read this notice closely for more information on how you can reduce lead in your drinking water.

We take this very seriously. Here's important information on the health effects of lead from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

What are the health effects of lead?

€E Exposure to lead in drinking water can cause Α serious health effects in all age groups. Infants and children can have decreases in IQ and attention span. Lead exposure can lead to new learning and behavior problems or exacerbate existing learning and behavior problems.

The children of women who are exposed to lead before or during pregnancy can have increased risk of these adverse health effects. Adults can have increased risks of heart disease, high blood pressure, kidney, or nervous system problems.

Here's what you can do

Below are steps you can take to reduce your risk of lead exposure in drinking water. For more information on reducing lead exposure from your drinking water and the health effects of lead, visit EPA's website at www.epa.gov/lead.

Flush your taps by running the cold water for 30 seconds to 2 minutes each time prior to using for drinking or cooking.	Clean faucet screens or aerators.	
Use cold water for drinking, and cooking. Boiling water does not remove lead.	Use a filter certified to remove lead.
